Two of Georgia's promising young athletes added to the Winning medal count for Team USA at the IAAF World Youth Championships in Lille, France.

Nnenya Hailey, a junior at Mt. Vernon Presbyterian Academy (Atlanta, GA), who set a PR 58.44 in leading the 400 hurdle semis; set a 2011 World Youth Leading time of 57.93.in winning the GOLD MEDAL in the 400 hurdles.



Kendell Williams, a sophomore at Kell High School, (Marietta, GA), achieved a personal record (PR) in win-ning the BRONZE MEDAL in 100 hurdles with a time of 13.28.

Team USA tops medal count at IAAF World Youth Championships

In spectacular fashion Team USA topped the overall medal count at the IAAF World Youth Championships in Lille, France.

The United States boys squad, who have only once failed to take the Medley Relay title, scored a fifth consecutive victory with a superlative and World Youth Best Performance to win ahead of Japan and France in the last race of the championship.

With displays of speed on each and every one of the 100m, 200m, 300m and 400m legs their team of Ronald Darby, Aldrich Bailey, Najee Glass and **Arman Hall** smashed through the 1min 50sec barrier for the first time clocking 1:49.47.
